## Today's Plan:

Learning Target (standard): I will find the average value of a function and describe its meaning.

Students will: Complete practice problems over previous concepts at the boards, put up homework problems on the board and make necessary corrections to their own work, take notes over new material and complete practice problems over new concepts.

Find the integral.

$$\int \left(3\sqrt{x} + 5x^{-\frac{2}{3}}\right) dx = \int \left(3x^{\frac{1}{2}} + 5x^{-\frac{2}{3}}\right) dx$$

$$= 2x^{\frac{2}{3}} + 15x^{\frac{1}{3}} + C$$

$$= 2\sqrt{x^3} + 15x^{\frac{1}{3}} + C$$

Find the integral.

$$\int \frac{5x^{3} - \frac{1}{x}}{3\sqrt{x}} dx = \int \frac{5x^{3} - x^{-1}}{3x^{\frac{1}{2}}} dx$$

$$= \frac{1}{3} \int x^{-\frac{1}{2}} (5x^{3} - x^{-1}) dx$$

$$= \frac{1}{3} \left( (5x^{\frac{3}{2}} - x^{-\frac{3}{2}}) dx \right)$$

$$= \frac{1}{3} \left( (\frac{10}{7}) x^{\frac{7}{2}} + 2 x^{-\frac{1}{2}} \right) + C$$

$$= \frac{10}{21} \sqrt{x^{7}} + \frac{2}{3\sqrt{x}} + C$$

$$= \frac{10\sqrt{x^{8}} + 2}{2\sqrt{x}} + C$$

$$= \frac{10x^{4} + 2}{2\sqrt{x}} + C$$

$$\int \sqrt{3x+5} dx = \int (3x+5)^{\frac{1}{2}} dx$$

$$U = 3x+5$$

$$du = 3 dx$$

$$\frac{1}{3} du = dx$$

$$= \frac{1}{3} \left(\frac{2}{3} u^{\frac{3}{2}}\right) + C$$

$$= \frac{2}{9} \sqrt{(3x+5)^3} + C$$

## Find the integral.

$$\int (3x^{2}-5)^{6} x dx$$

$$U=3x^{2}-5$$

$$du=6x dx$$

$$=\frac{1}{6} \left(\frac{1}{7} u^{7}\right)+C$$

$$=\frac{1}{42} u^{7}+C$$

$$=\frac{1}{42} \left(3x^{2}-5\right)^{7}+C$$

Find the integral.

$$\int \frac{5x}{\sqrt{2-x^2}} dx = 5 \int x(2-x^2)^{-\frac{1}{2}} dx$$

$$U = 2 - x^2 = -5 \int \sqrt{2-x^2} dx$$

$$-\frac{1}{2} du = x dx$$

$$= -\frac{5}{2} \left(2 u^{\frac{1}{2}}\right) + C$$

$$= -5 u^{\frac{1}{2}} + C$$

Find the integral.

$$\int \frac{1}{(x+2)^2} dx = \int 0^{-2} du$$

$$0 = X+2 = -0^{-1} + C$$

$$0 = dx = -(x+2)^{-1} + C$$

$$= -\frac{1}{X+2} + C$$

$$\int_{2}^{5} -4(x-2)^{\frac{1}{3}} dx = -4 \left( \frac{3}{4} \right)^{\frac{1}{3}} dx$$

$$V = X-2 \qquad X=5 \qquad = -4 \left( \frac{3}{4} \right)^{\frac{1}{3}} \right) \left( \frac{3}{4} \right)^{\frac{3}{3}} dx$$

$$X = 2 \qquad = -3 \left( \frac{3}{3} \right)^{\frac{1}{3}} dx$$

$$= -3 \left( \frac{3}{3} \right)^{\frac{1}{3}} dx$$
